STORIES OF GOD'S PRESENCE

- Stories need to be submitted by February 9th
- Stories need to be 325 words or less
- Stories will be edited for publication purposes
- A favorite/applicable Bible verse may be included (this is optional and is not part of the 325 words)
- We will upload these stories to our church's website
- Stories in electronic form will be appreciated and can be emailed to office@communitycovenant.com
- If you need help writing your story, we will help you by providing one of our "ghost writers"
- Stories can be published as *anonymous*
