UPDATE FROM CONGREGATIONAL MEETING HELD SUNDAY, MARCH 15, 2015

The Congregation met on Sunday, March 8 after Worship to discuss and vote on the proposed budget cuts being made by the Leadership Team. The goal of the Leadership Team was to develop a proposed budget reduction that would be the least impactful to the Church's while recognizing that any cut to the budget would impact God's ministry. Below is a summary of the proposals and the results of the Congregational vote.

The following proposed budget cuts will have an immediate positive impact to the church's undesignated fund balance as these are current expenses being paid:

Global Missions

- Suspend the contribution to the Evangelical Covenant Church through June. The anticipated savings is \$1,667.
- Suspend the contribution to the East Coast Conference through June. The anticipated savings is \$3,003.
- Reduce the budgeted expenses to various global missionaries and organizations. The actual savings that will be recognized through the end of the year is \$1,209.

Total anticipated savings from the above items is \$5,878.65. All of these suggested cuts were approved by the Congregation.

Personnel

- Reduce the hours of the Administrative Assistant by 20%. The actual savings through the end of the year would be \$3,335.

After a lengthy discussion amongst the members of the Congregation, a motion was put forward to remove the changes to the Administrative Assistant's position from the proposed budget cuts. The motion was seconded and passed. This item was removed from the proposed list of budget cuts.

The following proposed budget cuts do not have an immediate impact to the undesignated fund balance as they are not currently being spent. These proposals only reduce potential spending in the future. All of these items were approved by the Congregation.

Worship & Music	Reduce the budgeted expenses by \$770.
Sunday School	Reduce the budgeted expenses by \$350.
Youth Ministry	Reduce the budgeted expenses by \$400.
Faith Community	Reduce the budgeted expenses by \$200.
Administrative	Reduce the budgeted expenses by \$200.
Miscellaneous Supplies	Reduce the budgeted expenses by \$250.
Personnel (Childcare Coordinator)	Reduce the budgeted expenses by \$1,302 (by suspending through June)

In addition to the above referenced items, the Congregation also voted to approve two additional recommendations made by the Leadership Team:

1. Send a letter to the outside groups that use the church during the week to request a free-will offering to offset the additional snow removal charges that were necessary to keep the building open. Update: this letter was mailed on March 13.
2. Allow a "Special Offering" during a regular Sunday Worship for the specific goal of offsetting the additional unanticipated monies required for snow plowing and snow removal off the roof. Update: This letter was mailed on March 16 and the special offering is today, March 22.

REVELATION 1 - 3

An Encounter with a Book in the Bible

There's smoke; there are weird monsters; there are angels and dragons and symbols and signs: it's the book of Revelation. Does this strange book have any significance for us today? What was the Apostle John's purpose in writing this book? Believe it or not, this book is far more applicable than many tend to think.

This course will examine the first three chapters of the book of Revelation, considering the content of the letters John wrote to seven local churches. If you've ever wondered about the book of Revelation, or if you simply think that Revelation has no practical relevance to your life, this course is for you. So, bring your curiosity, your mind, and most importantly, your heart, as we explore God's words to some local churches remarkably similar to our own.

We will explore and experience several spiritual practices that encourage personal spiritual growth in Christ. Whether you have never experienced a Spiritual Practice or are very familiar with Spiritual Practices, this class is for you. As we grow in our intimacy with Christ, so we will grow in our relationships with each other. Come and grow. Come and hear God's voice speak to you.

Join in the fun. Both classes are open to all adults (post High School – Senior Adult). **Sunday School is for all ages.** After all, we are all life-long learners. Sunday School is not just for children. God wants everyone to develop into mature followers of Jesus Christ. Here is a great opportunity to be on the learning/growing journey with Christ.
